

Coauthor: "Teaching Rural Law in Pa. Voc. High Schools". Author: "Scoring Judging Contests", which presented the scoring system in use since 1936 in the national F.F.A. contests. Organized and directed Pa. State F.F.A. Band, one of the outstanding organizations of its kind in the country and official band of the National F.F.A. Conv. at Kansas City in 1939. Member of Technical Comm. of the National Comm. on Standards in Agr. Ed., and author of "Criteria for Evaluating Programs of Preparation for Teachers of Voc.
