GRIFFIN, Frederick Llewellyn, 1884- City born. Reared in western Oregon farming community. B.S., Oregon State, Cut from 1908; M.S., 1911. High school teacher and ag. college teacher-trainer, 1911- Helped develop in California, glossy print of and establish in Oregon, ag. teacher-training depts. during pre-Smith-Hughes era. Served as first State favorite photo. leader of club work for boys and girls in Oregon, 1914-1916; and as first State leader of junior extension work in New York, 1916-1918. Head of Ag. Ed. division, University of California, 1919-1926. Supervisor of Two-Year Curricula, College of Ag., Davis, California, 1927- Early convert to idea that club work is educational, and, therefore, a responsibility of the public school system; the land-grant colleges and the U.S.D.A. to provide cooperative leadership and technical information. Aided in pioneering the movement to these good ends, with lasting benefits. Will be remembered, also, as one of the many who helped materialize the dreams of the pioneers in vocational agricultural education. -- Geo. A. Works and R. W. Stimson.
