HATCH, Kirk Lester, 1871- Farm born near Loyd, Wis. Educated in district school. By home study, qualified to teach rural schools. Trained at Plattville State Normal School. Taught graded school at Viola, then high schools at Sextonville, Black Earth, and Waterloo. University of Wisconsin College of Agriculture, B.S.A., 1909. Superintendent of Winnebago County School of Ag. Arts, 1907-1909. Here developed a strong ag. extension this county the attention of the College of Agriculture

and Domestic Arts, 1907-1909. Here developed a strong ag. extension program; and this caught the attention of the College of Agriculture. Organized Ag. Extension at the University of Wisconsin in 1909; then became Asst, Director in 1914, and Associate Director in 1931. His greatest work was development in Wisconsin of a state system of extension service for ag. and home economics, based on taxation, and supported by funds from county, state, and nation. Taught earliest known classes in ag. extension methods. Retired after 27 years in extension service. But he also organized ag. teacher training, in 1909; and became the first president of the American Assoc. for the Advancement of Ag. Teaching.
