in his approval of a high school ag. evening course for 100 eager
French-speaking potato growers in the St. John section of Aroostook

agricultural teachers for Maine and supervised their work in the schools
of Maine. He has been a leader in School and Home Farm Cooperation,

whose voice at Regional conferences has been the voice of progressive
