JOYNER, James Yadkin, 1862- North Carolina born. Cut from Univ. No. Car., Ph.B., 1881. A teacher 34 years, public school to Univ. of No. Car. County and city glossy school supt. Appointed State Supt. Public Instruction, print of 1902; and elected four consecutive terms, 1904, 1908, favorite 1912, 1916. Ag. and ed. his chief interests. Active in aid of farm and ed. organizations and cooperatives. President of Tobacco Growers Assoc., 1922. Pres. Nat. Ed. Assoc., 1909; and of Southern ed. associations. Trustee of several colleges. Campaigned for ag. ed. in schools. With other Southern Supts., studied systems of ag. ed. on the spot in several Midwestern states. One result: No. Car. Farm Life School Law, 1911. Promoted comprehensive program of voc. ed. Requested Legislature to match Federal funds, 1917. On first State Bd. Voc. Ed. Advocated rural school consolidation, longer terms, better salaries, and school libraries. Constitutional amendment extending required term from 4 to 6 months voted during his adm adm. In 1943, urged General Assembly to pass State-supported 9-month term. Respected. Honored. Loved.
