MC CORMICK, Cyrus Hall, 1809-1884. Va. Farm born. Of excellent MESKE
Scotch-Irish ancestry. Emancipator of farmer from back-breaking
toil of harvesting/ by hand. Inventor of the reaper. First reaper sale
in history, 1840. 50 sold from home farm workshop in 1844. Went west.

Year of his death, 54,841 reapers sold world-wide. Originated deferred
payment system, because he trusted practical farmers. Will to succeed,
indomitable. "From the crude reaper of 1831 has come the modern harvester-thresher which cuts fifty acres a day, threshes the grain,
cleans it, and delivers it ready for the granary. From the simple
little log forge shop in Walnut Grove, Virginia, has developed the
