OBYE, Charles H., 1894- Major, Infantry, PMS&T, 1944-Iowa St. Col. grad., in first ag. ed. class, 1916. Supt. Chicago Schools E. G. Cooley, with interested citizens of Strawberry Point, Ia., his home in boyhood, got cooperation of School Board, Community Club, and Cooperative Creamery, for a trial of voc. type of ag. ed. Mr. Obye was selected instr., and began work in June, 1916. During the summer, he visited farmers, helped Creamery patrons with their problems, and enrolled 22 boys who had completed or dropped out of high school for a 5-mo. special ag. course. High School ag. class and this special ag. course were started in fall, Of the 22 who entered the special course, 18 completed it. Much practical work on farms was done by all. The venture succeeded. Again funds for it were voted. After Iowa accepted Federal aid under the Smith-Hughes Act of 1917, the Strawberry Point ag. dept. was approved to continue the work so capably started; and at this writing in 1944, this dept. is still in operation. Here was a balanced program: itinerant for adult-farmers, special-course for out-of-school youth, and day-class for in-school pupils, worthy of universal emulation; and here, an alert and far-sighted pioneer who merits grateful remembrance. -- Barton Morgan and
