A., Senior Agriculturist, Office of Instruction and Cooperative Extension Work, 1919-1931. By 1920, unit course and job plan methods of teaching vocational agriculture had come into use Nationwide. Between 1920 and 1923, cooperating on the part of the MXXXXXX U.S.D.A., Mr. Schopmeyer prepared for publication by the Federal Board for Vocational Education: Bul. 63, "A Unit Course in Poultry Husbandry;" Bul. 68, "A Unit Course in Swine Husbandry;" Bul. 74, "Analyzing a Potato Enterprise;" Bul. 75, "Analyzing a Poultry Enterprise;" and MXXXXX Bul. 88, "Analysis of the Management of a Farm Business." Also, between

1925 and 1927, he aided Federal Agent A. P. Williams of the Federal Board for Vocational Education in preparing for publication three more enterprise analyses: Bul. 101 and Bul. 118 analyzed jobs in corn grow-

ing; and the third, in cotton growing. He thus became a National, teamwork, figure, -- competent, admired, respected; and as such, he will be gratefully remembered. -- E. H. Shinn and R. W. Stimson.
