
SEARS, Fred C., 1866- Brought up on 1,000 acre farm

Author: "Productive Orcharding," 1914, Lippincott; "Productive Small Fruit Culture," 1920, Lippincott; and "Fruit Growing Projects," 1928, Macmillan; also bulletins and articles. In Labrador 11 summers, with 1936 out, 1928-1939, working with Sir Wilfred Frenfell and his Mission, promoting vegetable growing for better health. First teacher, part-time, at the first state-aided vocational agricultural school in Mass., 1908-1909, to aid in establishing xxprepasedxbxxthiexepasear the principle, proposed for general adoption by this sponsor, that findings for farmers released by a State Ag. Col. should be put promtly into practice for profit through schools, on school land, if any, and always on the home farms of students. Widely admired for his ready wit, and honored for his unfailing wisdom. -- R. W. Stimson.
