years. A rural school to/was a place where children and adults might learn to solve the problems of home, farm, and community, by working at them. Led by him, extension workers assembled classes, ag. teachertrainers provided special subject-matter, and voc. ag. dept. instructors did the teaching. 46,600 farmers thereby benefited in 1942. In 1940-1942, he had more than 1,000 classes for out-of-school farm boys. In 1942, more than 500 all-day class centers were "a monument to his efforts." Practically all of these had community canning plants, farm shops, community spray pumps, and seed treating machines; and many of them had freezer-lockers, fence-post treating plants, saw mills, feed mills, terracing machines, and the like. He himself was president of the cooperative creamery he had helped to organize in his community. Repeatedly he was called to Washington for legislative committee work. He was co-author of ag. books. In short, in Community, State, and Nation, he was a teamworker extraordinary, -- loved and respected, and now gratefully remembered. -- John T. Wheeler and R. W. Stimson.
