
WHEELER, John Taylor, 1886- Pennsylvanian by birth, Georgian by adoption. Univ. Wisconsin, B.S.A., 1916; Cut from glossy M.S., 1924. Cornell Univ., Ph.D., 1930. Supt. of schools. print sent me. College teacher of science. Asst. Prof. of Horticulture at Mass. St. College. While in Mass., studied "School and Home Farm with a willing tutor, Cooperation" concept and program, \*ith-a-willing-tutor, at Northampton and other schools with varied farming problems. November, 1937, wrote: "There I received the inspiration that changed the course of my life .... and gained the philosophy of ed. which I/new hold. In 1917, I came to Georgia, and brought with me ... (this) philosophy ... " First employee in Ga. voc. ed. program. First ag. teacher-trainer at Univ. of Ga. Has stressed balanced ed. for farmer-citizenship. Resourceful unfolder of new methods. Developed apprentice teacher-training, brought to nationwide attention in U.S. Office of Ed. Bul. 219,1941; including training young teachers of adults, under the philos., "Facts take the feat out of facing farmers." Helped carry ed. program under A.A.A. to more than half-million farmers Southwide. On American Council Near East abroad. Foundation, which carried ag. ed. and the Future Farmer movement/into Albania, -Greece, -Iran, -Iraq, -and -Turkey, -Effective -speaker, and -writerspeaker, -writer, and -consultant -of-articles-and-books: -- Widely-sought /collaborator-and-consultant.
