COOK, Glen Charles, 1897- Of Nebraska farmer parentage. Lived on a farm until 19 years old. University of Nebraska, B.Sc., 1922; M.Sc. 1923. Graduate work University of Hawaii 1938, and Michigan State Agricultural College, 1939-40; Taught rural school, Nebraska, 1917-1919; Vocational Agriculture, Nebraska, 1923-1928. Assistant State Supervisor and Assistant Teacher-trainer

Agricultural Education, North Dakota, 1928-1936; teacher-trainer in charge of "Fifth Year Cadet" program University of Hawaii, 1936-1938 and Michigan State Agricultural College 1938-40; U. S. Office of Education, 1940. Author "A Handbook on Teaching Vocational Agriculture" 1934, revised 1936 and 1938; "Student Notebook in Vocational Agriculture" 1937; "Workbook in Farm Mechanics" 1936, revised 1940; "380 Things to Make for Farm and Home" 1941. Co-author "Farm Mechanics Text and Handbook" 1935, revised 1939; "Practical Methods in Teaching Farm Mechanics" 1936, revised 1941.
