

GEORGE, Walter Franklin, 1878 - Born, reared and life-long resident of rural Georgia. Mercer University, B. S., 1900; Ll.B., 1901; Ll.D., 1920. The problems of farming and of rural education with which he was always surrounded were a main interest on local, state, and national levels. Lived in the open country at Vienna, Ga., since 1901, where he was selected Solicitor General of Cordele Judicial Circuit, 1907; Judge of the Superior Court of same circuit, 1912-1916; and Judge of Court of Appeals, 1917; appointed Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of Georgia, serving until elected U. S. Senator, 1922, and now (1945) serving the fifth consecutive term as Senator and staunch supporter of Federal aid to agricultural education. Sponsor of the George-Reed Act of 1929; the George-Ellzey Act of 1933, and the George-Deen Act of 1937. -- John T. Wheeler.
