

GIBSON, Heber Howard, 1884 - Farm reared, rural teacher, Ohio. 30 years farming-manager or operator - Ohio, Neb., Ore. Denison Univ. A.B., 1909; Columbia M.A., 1912. While graduate student at Cornell 1913-15, Dr. A.R. Mann advised meeting with Dr. George A. Works - the time and place where road forked into Agricultural Education Highway. Head, dept. biology and agriculture, Kearney State Normal, Neb. 1915. College, and critic teacher, Anes, Ia. 1915-17; state supervisor Ag. Ed., Vt. 1917-19. Started Ag. teacher training, Univ. of Ariz. as dept. head, 1919-21. Head, dept. Ag. Ed., Ore. State College 1921 ---. Summer session teacher Cal. '21; Colo. '39, '40; Hawaii post session '40. Since 1928 required student participation in teaching adult farmer classes; since 1936, out-of-school young farmers. Member National Committee on "Training Objectives in Voc. Ag. Ed.", 1939. Editor, "Supervised Practice" Ag. Ed. Mag., 1937-41; editor Byram's comment, Dec. '41: "Prof. Gibson has made a contribution which has marked a new high from the standpoint of introduction of new ideas, development of philosophies and standardization of techniques." -- G. A.
