McCLELLAND, John Barnhart, 1896-  
 Born near New Alexandria, Pennsylvania. ~~Obtained Farm~~  
 experience in ~~Pennsylvania~~ and in Ohio. Attended secondary  
 school and college at Wooster, Ohio. Served eighteen months  
 in France, 1917-1918. Received B.S. in Agriculture, M.S. and  
 Ph.D. at Ohio State University. Taught ~~vocational~~ <sup>Voc ag.</sup> agriculture  
 and served as ~~assistant state supervisor of agriculture in~~ <sup>asst. St. Sup. ag. in,</sup>  
 Ohio, 1921-1933. Directed Emergency Adult Education Program  
 in Ohio, 1933-1935, and was specialist in Agricultural Education <sup>Ag. Ed.</sup>  
 (part-time and evening schools), U. S. Office of Education, 1935.  
 Was a ~~Member~~ <sup>Member</sup> of resident teaching staff in Agricultural Education, <sup>Ag. Ed.</sup>  
 Ohio State University, 1936-1939. Member of resident teaching  
 and Experiment Station staffs at Iowa State College, 1939- .  
 Special Editor, Part-time Schools, Agricultural Education Magazine,  
 1936-1943. Associate editor, Adult Education Bulletin, 1943- .  
 Author of Opportunities for Placement and Establishment on Farms  
in Selected Ohio Communities, doctor's dissertation, Ohio State  
 University, 1940. Special interest - development of young farmer  
 programs in vocational agriculture. Was influential in the  
 development of Young Farmer's Associations through contributions  
 as organizer and advisor of one of the earliest associations in  
 the United States and as assistant supervisor in charge of part-
