 ..... Ed., 1936- Co-author "The Nature and Purpose of Educa-  
 tion," 1929, Collegiate Press, Ia. St. Col. \* "Personality," 1935, mim-  
 eographed by printing dept., Ia. St. Col., and sold by the college  
 bookstore for use in ed. classes. Latter persistently requested and  
 studied elsewhere widely in U. S. President, Ia. St. Teachers Assoc.,  
 1937-1938; and Pres., Rural Ed. Dept., N.E.A., 1942-1944. Introduced  
 ag. into 3 schools. Taught voc. ag. in approved dept. Made schools he  
 administered community centers for ed. and recreation of farm people,  
 both children and adults. Introduced rural life sequence courses at  
 consolidated high school. Unusually successful in developing an under-  
 standing and ~~and~~ appreciation of country life. Has consistently and  
 strongly stressed, in person and in print; upgrading teaching and re-  
 search; social and economic phases of farming and farm life; extending  
 part-time courses, and especially comprehensive evening schools; and  
 training both ~~xx~~ farm technicians and agri-  
 cultural statesmen. Believes the public schools should teach agricul-  
 ture and farm life in all their aspects, local, national, and inter-  
 national.
