 Norfolk Co. Farm Bur. antedated Norfolk Co. Ag. School. Helped that
 Bureau get legislation to establish that School, and became Head of
 its Extension Service Dept. One of the first to sense the promise of
 "Smith-Hughes" and "Smith-Lever" teamwork. Laid out the school orchard
 for teaching and demonstration uses. Assisted teachers in other mat-
 ters at the school, and was assisted by school staff specialists both
 in programs at the school and on problems in the field. United with
 State Supervisor in putting such teamwork into action statewide. Credit
 for his strong and consistent support of such cooperation is recorded
 on pages 206-207 in the U. S. Office of Education "Hist. Ag. Ed. of
 Less Than College Grade in the United States", published in December,
 1944, by the U. S. Govt. Prntg. Office, ~~xxxxxxxxxxx~~ ~~TEAMWORK~~
 under the heading TEAMWORK: VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND EXTENSION SERVICE, as
 follows: "Teamwork assistance from Massachusetts State College through
 W. A. Munson, director of the extension service since September 1926,
 his specialists, and county agricultural agents working under his gen-
 eral supervision, has been valuable to vocational agricultural direc-
 tors and instructors in establishing on farms the various and numer-
 ous means and methods proposed by experts for the betterment of farm-
 ing in Massachusetts.....No formal memorandum of agreement has been
 necessary; cooperative agreements have been adopted, step by step, as
