

WALLACE, Henry Cantwell, 1866-1924. Ill. born. Became successively an Iowa farmer, agricultural college graduate and professor, editor-publisher, and agricultural statesman. He "saw in farming not only a good business, but the best opportunity in the world to raise sturdy boys and girls into the highest type of American citizen. He devoted his efforts to making farming a paying business, in order that the yearly profits might be made the basis of dividends of human opportunity and happiness." In the second/^{of three}generations of Wallaces who together "made a contribution to agricultural life.....comparable in character and importance to the contribution made to political science and government by the Adamses."
