State Supervisor of Agric. Educ. <sup>1936-</sup> Established Collegiate Chapter Future Farmers of America at State College of Wash. 1939. Member of Phi Delta Kappa, Alpha Zeta, Grange, American Legion, Amer. Assoc. of Univ. Professors, Amer. Voc. Assoc., Wash. Educ. Assoc., Nat. Educ. Assoc., Chamber of Commerce, Tau Kappa Epsilon social fraternity, Christian Church. Influenced profoundly by a sincere belief in the future of farming and development of rural America. Insisting that practical experience is basically essential for success, he has inspired both students and teachers of agriculture by his practical example and instruction to acquire such experience.
