Samuel Calhoun, Wilson, January 5, 1877 October 21, 1939. From a pioneer Walker County family.

Attended Huntsville public schools and Sam Houston Normal Institution. Received B.S. Degree, 1905.

Did advance work at Univ. of Chicago, George Peabody College, Cornell University, Texas University.

He taught in Walker County public Schools;

Walker County supt. of schools, 1902-1910; Director of Agriculture and Agricultural Education in ~~S.H.S.T.C.~~ **Sam Houston State Teachers College,** 1910-1939. Due to his early and

continued interest in Agricultural Education he was called "The

Father of Vocational Agriculture in Texas." He was president of

Texas State Teachers Association and Texas Vocational Association.

He held a life membership in the A.V.A. Mr. Wilson directed one of

the first "Conferences on Rural Life and Education" at S.H.S.T.C.

He was a leader in education, civic, social and religious affairs in

Huntsville and the State of Texas. -- J. B. Rutland and C. H. Lane.
